From the President

I never stop being impressed by VBA members who are committed to our sport and step up when a challenge arises. The latest example came over the winter months, when some members of our Virginia Senate and House introduced legislation that would allow a new device called an “Airbow” (<http://www.crosman.com/airbow>) to be used during the state-wide archery season. This new device shoots an arrow with a standard broadhead out of a scoped rifle using compressed air, at an advertised 450 FPS speed. While I believe the legislators who proposed this legislation had good intent, this device is really an “Airgun”, and has no place being used as a legal hunting device during the archery season. In fact, if it had passed, Virginia would have become the first state to approve its use during archery season! But fortunately, we have great members like our Shannon Nesselrodt, Ed Bickham and Curt Lytle who stepped up to speak at public hearings, mobilize a grass roots movement among our clubs, and personally contact legislators to explain our concerns. Through their efforts, we were able to effectively communicate our concerns, and through a letter writing campaign, let them know how many of our members felt this way. Through their efforts, a compromise was reached. The Airgun was approved for use by handicapped hunters for use during the state archery season, and may be used by any hunter during muzzle loader and modern gun seasons. I think this is a reasonable, fair use of this weapon. I would like to publicly thank Shannon, Ed and Curt for leading this effort, and all of you who participated in the letter writing campaign or contacted your State Representative to express your concern. Well Done!

While I don't normally do re-runs of my article, I have recently been hearing some of our newer members asking what the Virginia Bowhunters Association does for them. I addressed that back in 2016, and since the question seems to have surfaced again, I would like to provide the answer I gave back then.

Let's start off with the purpose of the VBA. Article 2 of our Constitution provides the following mission statement: “The purpose of this Association shall be to foster, expand and perpetuate the use of the bow in hunting all legal game; to cooperate with conservation organizations, Game and Fish Commission, and Forestry Services in their efforts for preservation of our natural resources and wildlife; to promote and encourage all approaches to competitive archery activities within the State of Virginia; and to generally require the highest standards of sportsman-like conduct in all phases of archery.”

Since our Constitution charges the VBA to support bowhunting, let's go there first. As illustrated above, a large part of what your elected Officers and club Delegates do is to represent your club (and the bowhunting community at large) on a wide variety of issues that impact, or potentially could impact, bowhunting throughout the Commonwealth. Representatives of the VBA regularly attend meetings, write letters, and contacting the state leadership in order to make sure your voice and opinions are heard. If you are a bowhunter, you can be assured the VBA

is protecting your right to bowhunt in the Commonwealth, and sounding the alarm whenever an issue surfaces anywhere in the state that threatens this important part of our outdoor heritage!

And let's not forget that the VBA sponsored the International Bowhunters Education Program to both educate hunters and teach new instructors throughout the state years before the VDGIF decided to sponsor this important bowhunting safety course. Your VBA continues to sponsor it today, and all VBA clubs have the opportunity to host IBEP classes for their members through the VBA's IBEP Coordinator.

What about that portion of our archery community that are strictly target shooters? What does the VBA do for you? First off, do you use the VBA Shoot Card to plan your weekend shooting? Every September the VBA hosts the club Delegates for a meeting where we work out the shooting schedule for the next year, and de-conflict any dates where two clubs in the same zone both have shoots scheduled. That allows you to attend both on different dates, instead of having to choose one over the other. And have you noticed that the shooting styles, rules and guidelines are the same at any VBA club where you shoot? That's because the VBA offers a forum where your club Delegates can discuss and approve changes so you don't find the same equipment you shot with last week puts you into a completely different shooting class the next week when you shoot at another club. Another key point – did you know that the VBA inspects the ranges of member clubs? This is done both to ensure they are laid out in a way that ensures your safety when you shoot on your club's ranges, as well as to make sure archers are not impeded by obstacles when shooting in tournaments. Then there are the State Championships – State Indoor, Spring 3-D Classic, Fall 3-D Classic, State Open and State Closed. These competitive shoots not only give you a chance to test your skills but also to recognize those archers which truly excel in their class and style. They also serve as tune ups for these same archers who compete at the National Level. All because your VBA and club Delegates make this happen!

In short, if you are connected to the sport of archery in anyway, the VBA is there for you, with ongoing programs that live up to our mission statement to promote bowhunting and archery across the Commonwealth. It ensures the sport we all love will be here for our children to enjoy just as much as we do. I don't think you can find a better value for your money!

COMPETITION: During the 2018 State Indoor Sectional we had four archers so focused they decided to place one arrow into another thereby earning the "Robin Hood Pin" at the 2018 State Indoor Sectionals. These 4 archers are Tom Korbini from Massanutten Archery Club (MAC); Jeff McManus from Staunton River Archery Club (SRAC); John Weller (Manahoac Bowmen); and Steve Richards from (Belvoir Bowhunters). Congratulations to all of our 2018 Indoor Sectional and Spring 3-D State Champions.

The total number of classed shooters were 58 during the Spring 3-D State shoot with about 27 of them being guest. AGENDA ITEMS

1. Sect.15.1.10, Registration Fees, PG. 12: Add Sect. E: A 80% refund will be sent to preregistered shooters upon a written request submitted within two weeks of tournament. The host club may keep 20% of fee and send refund within 14 days to shooter. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY. Passed 33-1.
2. Require the posting of all agenda items with submitting club name to the Flight issue, directly following the VBA quarterly meeting. Posting of voting results of agenda items to include the roll call votes for each item in the Flight Magazine, following the votes. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY. Passed 30-4 , amended see VBA Homepage at www.vbarchers.com.
3. Bowhunters of Rockingham would like for the VBA to donate a 48"x48" block target to the town of Shenandoah for their new range. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY. Passed 18-5, and 2AB.
4. Sherwood Archers proposes that the format for the State Indoor Tournament be changed to allow each of the hosting clubs to choose to hold 2 rounds each day, instead of the normal 3. Shooting times will be the club's choice. Also, we propose to give the club's the option to opt out of the Friday night registration. Each hosting club would be responsible to show changes and advertise it in the Flight and Contracts. EFFECTIVE, 2019. Passed, 33 and 1 AB, Amended.

DGIF ADVISES CAUTION ON WEBSITES SELLING FISHING LICENSES

RICHMOND, VA – The Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) is putting out an advisory to the public about websites claiming to sell Virginia fishing licenses. We want to remind you that GoOutdoorsVA.com and dgif.virginia.gov are the only official websites to purchase fishing and hunting licenses, and permits. If you have a smart phone, you can access the [Go Outdoors Virginia mobile app](#) for license purchases.

Some of the sites we are aware of are: fishinglicense.org; fishandgamelicense.org; recreationallicense.org; licenceses.org; and hunting-license.org.

DGIF has no affiliation with these sites. Customers have reported completing transactions on these sites believing they were buying a license or permit, when, in fact, they purchased an informational guide.

The “Dave Proctor Bowhunter Award for the Virginia Bowhunters Association”

The “Dave Proctor Bowhunter Award” program has been created by the VBA in memory of and with great respect to David Proctor who served the VBA as Hunting VP and Executive VP for many years in a dedicated and exemplary manner, giving us all an example of a true Virginia sportsman and bowhunter.

The “Dave Proctor Award” is effective for the harvest of all big and small game beginning January 14, 2018. Game harvested shall be reported to the VBA Secretary each year on the form provided by the VBA. The reporting year shall coincide with the end of the regular Virginia archery season, the first Saturday in January of each year, through the end of the season the next year. The reporting form shall be mailed to the VBA secretary no later than 30 days after the end of the reporting year.

The “Dave Proctor Bowhunter Award” is available to current members of the VBA. Any game reported must have been taken while a member of the VBA, game harvested prior to becoming a member are not eligible. Each level achieved must be completed before a member can begin accumulating points for the next award level. All game taken must be harvested according to rules of “fair chase” and in compliance with all game

laws and regulations of the state or locality in which harvested. All game reported for this award must have been harvested by means of legal Virginia archery equipment. Game reported may be from Virginia or wherever the travels of the VBA member may take them, across the country or around the world. Any member known to report illegal kills or falsifying game reported will forfeit all accumulated points and will be disqualified from participating in the “Dave Proctor Award” program thereafter.

There shall be three (3) levels of achievement for the “David Proctor Bowhunter Award”. All award levels will be achieved according to the points system as listed below:

FIRST AWARD – “Virginia Bowhunter”

A total of fifty (50) points are needed to achieve the “David Proctor Virginia Bowhunter” award level. At least four (4) different game species are required, one (1) of which must be a big game animal. Members achieving this award will be presented with a “VBA David Proctor Virginia Bowhunter” Certificate recognizing their achievement and will be acknowledged in the Flight newsletter.

SECOND AWARD – “Southern Bowhunter”

A total of one hundred (100) points are needed to achieve the “David Proctor Southern Bowhunter Award”. At least four (4) game species are required, two (2) of which must be big game animals. Members achieving this award will be presented with a special edition “VBA David Proctor Southern Bowhunter” Sheath Knife recognizing their achievement and will be acknowledged in the Flight newsletter.

THIRD AWARD – “Ultimate Virginia Bowhunter”

A total of one hundred fifty (150) points are needed to achieve the “David Proctor Ultimate Virginia Bowhunter Award”. At least four (4) game species are required, three (3) of which must be big game animals. Members achieving this award will be presented with a special edition VBA David Proctor Ultimate Bowhunter Custom Embroidered Hunting Jacket recognizing their achievement, will be honored as a special “Ultimate Bowhunter” guest of the VBA president at the next VBA banquet, and will be acknowledged in the Flight newsletter.

Note: This Awards Program is based on an awards program that Dave Proctor developed in 1984 and managed for the Bowhunters Of Rockingham. The BOR award is called the “Southern Bowhunter Award”. Many BOR members have worked to achieve these awards over the years.

Note: Snakes and other types of nongame animals do not qualify for this award. Protected species do not qualify for this award.

Note: Should a VBA member harvest and report a recognized game animal not listed here, the VBA Hunting VP shall assign a points value for that animal in keeping with the scale and difficulty as listed above.

16 NEW CWD POSITIVE WHITE-TAILED DEER IN NORTHWEST VIRGINIA

RICHMOND, VA- Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) was confirmed by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) in 14 deer in Frederick County and two deer in Shenandoah County during the 2017 deer hunting season. Fifteen of the deer were harvested by hunters and one deer was killed by a vehicle. Approximately 1,500 deer from Frederick, Clarke, Warren, and Shenandoah counties were tested for CWD during the hunting season. Since 2009, 38 CWD-positive deer have been confirmed in Frederick (35) and Shenandoah (3) Counties.

The Virginia CWD Containment Area borders are expected to remain the same – the four counties named above - for the fall 2018 hunting season. DGIF plans to collect CWD samples from the Containment Area on the first two Saturdays of the 2018 firearms deer season.

DGIF appreciates the assistance of deer hunters for the excellent cooperation during CWD sample collection this past fall. DGIF would also like to thank the cooperating road-kill contractor and deer processors for their assistance. We look forward to continuing these partnerships in 2018.

CWD has been detected in 24 states and three Canadian provinces. The disease is a slow, progressive neurologic (brain and nervous system) disease found in deer, elk, and moose in North America which ultimately results in death of the animal. It is spread through urine, feces, and saliva. Symptoms do not appear for several years and include staggering, abnormal posture, lowered head, drooling, confusion, and marked weight loss.

There is no evidence that CWD can be naturally transmitted to humans, livestock, or pets, but the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention advise hunters to test all deer harvested from known CWD-positive areas and to not consume any animals that test positive for the disease. Perfect Animal Any VBA member that shoots a 20 or higher on each of the 14 unit animal targets for a total score of 280 or more. The round must be shot from the adult stakes on a VBA approved range at a sanctioned VBA shoot. Conservation Scholarship




