From the President

This time of year we have a lot of our hunters who get the opportunity to bow hunt in other states. That usually generates a lot of questions regarding on-line International Bowhunting Education Courses, such as:

- Whether IBEP (or some form of bowhunting education) is required to archery hunt
- Whether the state offers an on-line IBEP certification, and the cost to take the on-line certification course in states that offer that option
- Whether there is a Field Training requirement in addition to the on-line portion
- The minimum age allowed to take each state's on-line course (important when you plan to take a younger bowhunter on the trip)
- And finally, whether they will allow a non-resident to take their on-line IBEP certification course

There have been several changes this year, so I did some research to see what the current situation is. The key information I gathered is as follows:

There are 36 states that currently offer hunters the opportunity to obtain an IBEP certification on-line. All are sponsored by the National Bowhunter Education Foundation (NBEF) and are available at <https://www.bowhunter-ed.com/>. The cost is the same for all states that offer the on-line option - \$30. In each case the on-line version allows you to take the course and take the test before you pay; but you must pay on-line before you get your results or a certification card. If you fail, you can go back to the study material to refresh and take the test again until you pass. After all, these states want you to successfully master the material and pass the test.

However, that's where the similarities between the states end. Fifteen of the 36 states only allow their state residents to take their on-line course, so they are not available to Virginia residents. The remaining 21 states have no residency requirements. However, of those, 15 require hunters to attend a Field Training event in their state to obtain the IBEP certification. Since traveling to another state to attend a Field Training event would be too much of a hardship on most Virginia residents, they are not really a good option. That leaves 6 states that do allow a non-resident to take their on-line course and do not require a Field Training event. Those are: Alaska, Idaho, Iowa, South Dakota, Utah, and Wisconsin. Of those, only two states – Alaska and Utah – do not have a minimum age requirement in order to obtain IBEP certification; something to consider if you are going to take a young hunter along with you. So, out of all this research, my recommendation for the best on-line IBEP certification option for Virginia residents is Alaska or Utah. Both are available on the web site provided above.


It is also worth mentioning that there is one state – Alaska – that has implemented a requirement to obtain a separate crossbow certification for anyone who wishes to hunt with a crossbow in Alaska. The required certification is the International Crossbow Education Program (ICEP) and can be obtained on-line at <https://www.crossbow-ed.com/>. The cost is \$30. Alaska also requires bowhunters to carry their IBEP and/or ICEP certification card on their person at all times when bowhunting.

One word of caution. It is your responsibility as a hunter to ensure any

state you plan on bowhunting will accept your on-line IBEP certification. For example, if you take the on-line IBEP course offered by Utah, which has no requirement for a Field Training event, and want to hunt in Montana, which requires a Field Training event for their on-line course, will they accept the Utah certification? Your best option is to contact the Game and Fish Department in the state where you are going to hunt and verify that your IBEP certification will be accepted.

From the Publicity Director

Our VBA State Tournaments are now behind us. We would like to Thank' and appreciate the clubs that hosted them. Yes, attendance keeps going down. Why? We need the clubs to answer that question and hopefully the attendance will start increasing next year. At the September's meeting, the Delegates voted for the clubs who will be hosting 2019 Tournaments. The State Indoors are: Belvoir Bowhunters, Bowhunters of Rockingham, Kingsboro Bowmen and Sherwood Archers. NORVA received the Spring 3-D, Sherwood the State Open, New River Bowhunters the Fall 3-D. Congratulations and the first for Massanutten Archery Club who will be hosting the State Closed.

The Bowhunting committee met on Saturday evening and proposed that the VDGIF move the Youth and Apprentice Bear Hunting weekend from Oct 13th & 14th to **September 29th & 30th**. This will allow the youths' more time to hunt and make it a lot safer in the woods prior to the Early Firearms and Regular Bear Season begins. Shannon will need all the clubs and bowhunters in the Commonwealth for **their support on this and your attendance** when the VDGIF Board of Directors meets. Shannon also mentioned that he received some more 'hand-made Bill Bennett plaques from Charlie Shupienus. Charlie, "Thank-you" and we appreciate them again! The Banquet committee discussed the upcoming banquet and ask the clubs to start accumulating donations for the banquet. The Tournament committee met as well and went over their proposed changes to the Double Crown awards and the 3-D Spring classes.

At the Scheduling Session, Bakari Dale, VBA Field VP, received the clubs' schedules for 2019. Bakari did it quite differently than in the past, using the spreadsheet that Jerry Wenzel has used over the years for Zone 2 clubs. The scheduling went very smoothly, less time and cost than in the past.

On Sunday, Jerry Wenzel gave a report on the Scholastic 3-D Archery (S3DA) "What's Happening in VA" and Manahoac Bowmen has agreed to support this program. Hopefully the other clubs will as well!

This summer, I helped the VDGIF at the VDOT Rodeo event and spoke to a representative from the Virginia Correctional Enterprises (VCE) who works with local governments, non-profit organizations, schools, churches, clubs' sports teams and many others to meet their needs for silk screened, embroidered items, clothing/footwear, drug testing kits, janitorial products, printing, safety eyewear, DMV vehicle plates and the VDGIF publications. This work is coordinated and done by the prisoners in Virginia. Go to www.GoVCE.net for details.

Two important items that were discussed: the "Silver Arrow Award." Bob has written a draft proposed language and then to the clubs for their comments. When it is approved, it will be added to the VBA By-laws as **Article 17**. Also, a Nominating Committee was formed that consist of Charlene McManus, Marie Bell and Robin Vogel for the 2019 VBA Election of Officers in June. The President and Executive Vice-President & FLIGHT Editor positions are open. Their duties and responsivities can be found in the VBA By-laws, Article 2 & 3.

I would like to 'Thank' New River Bowhunters (Tony Hall, President) who donated four cases of bottle water that will be sent to our First Responders of Hurricane Florence.

The 2018-2019 Hunting season is in full swing. Please be careful when you are in the woods. Make sure that your bow/arrows are fine-tuned, use the proper treestand and wear your safety harness. Don't forget to take a youth so they can enjoy, learn about bowhunting and what Mother Nature has to offer.

DR. WALTER R. DILLOW, JR.

The Order of the Golden Feather was recently informed and is sad to notify you that Doctor of Dentistry Walter R. Dillow, Jr. passed away on July 11, 2018 while attending an antique show in Raleigh, NC. Born in October 1935, he was a valued member of the Virginia Bowhunters Association and was elected in 1974 to its highest honor, the Order of the Golden Feather. His parents, Walter, Sr. and Virginia, were also elected to the OGF in 1982. All three were nominated by the Wythe Archers.

In addition to being a competitive archer, Dr. Dillow also hunted and fished often while at the same time enjoying golf. He loved wildlife and was a renowned antiquarian and humble philanthropist. He will be sincerely missed by the many friends whose lives he touched – especially those in the VBA. The VBA and the OGF extend our sincere belated condolences to his family and friends.

Wally and Winnie suggest all the Bear hunters out there, try this one.



Ingredients

2 1/2 lb. bear roast, cut into 1-inch chunks
4 ancho chiles
2 chipotle chiles
3 Tbsp. olive oil or bear fat
1 1/2 cups chopped onion
6 garlic cloves, minced
1 Tbsp. ground cumin
1 tsp. oregano
1 1/2 cups beef stock
1 1/2 cups chicken stock
1/2 cup frozen wild blueberries
Two 14.5-oz. cans black beans, rinsed and drained
Sour cream (optional)
1/4 cup cilantro, chopped (optional)
Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

Preparation

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Place the ancho chiles on a sheet pan and roast for 6 minutes. Meanwhile, boil about 2 cups of water. Remove the chiles from the oven; when cool enough to handle, snip off the stems and slice lengthwise to remove the seeds. Transfer to a small bowl and add just enough boiling water to cover. Let the chiles steep in the water until soft, about 30 minutes. Transfer the anchos, with their soaking water, to a blender along with the chipotles and process until very smooth.
2. While the chiles are soaking, dry the bear meat with paper towels, then salt and pepper it generously. Heat the olive oil over medium-high heat in a Dutch oven or other heavy pot. Add the meat, in batches, and brown it on all sides for about 10 minutes per batch, then transfer to a plate. Add another glug of olive oil if the pot goes dry for the second batch.
3. Reduce the heat to medium and add the onion. Cook, stirring occasionally, until soft and translucent, about 8 minutes. Add the garlic and cook, stirring, for another 2 minutes. Stir in the cumin and oregano, cook for a minute, then add the chile purée and bring to a boil. Return the meat to the pot along with the beef and chicken stocks. Add the blueberries, then bring to a simmer.
4. Simmer, uncovered, for about 1 hour and 45 minutes, or until the meat is very tender. Add the black beans and salt and pepper to taste, then simmer for another 10 minutes or so.
5. Serve hot, garnishing the chili with a dollop of sour cream and a sprinkling of cilantro as desired. ***Serves 6***

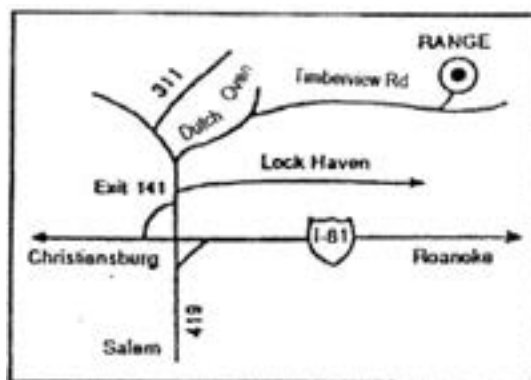

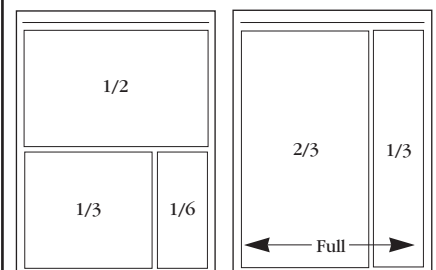

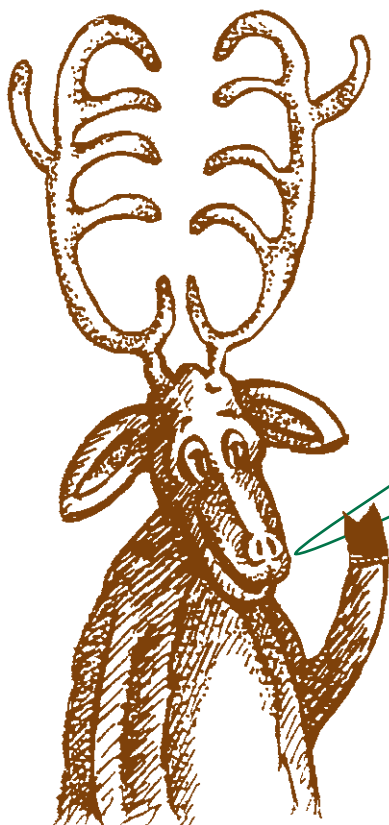

ORDER OF THE GOLDEN FEATHER

NOMINATIONS DUE IN MARCH

The VBA Order of the Golden Feather was created to honor those persons who have given unselfishly of their time and talents toward the betterment of archery and archers. Recipients are persons who possess the virtues of sportsmanship, character, morals, integrity and friendship. As a reflection of the substance for membership, only 80 people have been elected to the Order in the past 71 years.

To be qualified, a candidate must be member in good standing of the VBA at the time of nomination, must have a minimum of ten successive years' membership in the VBA and must be sponsored by three VBA members of good standing or by a VBA Club.

This article is a reminder that candidates must be submitted to the Board of Directors at the March meeting for this year. Nominations must be in writing and be signed by sponsoring individuals or a Club officer. Successful nominees have always performed duties or had an impact outside their immediate club.
