AGENDA ITEMS

Delete Art.7.NBEP Director and replace with Article 7, Parliamentarian. It shall be the duty of the Parliamentarian to assist the President in following Robert's Rules of Order during meetings of the Board of Directors. It shall also be his duty to interpret the Constitution and By-laws of the Association and to make any changes as voted on and directed by the Board of Directors. He shall make available an updated electronic copy of the Constitution and By-laws to all member clubs and Delegates in January of each year.

Also, in Table of Contents, change Art.7, NBEP Director to Parliamentarian. Sect.4.5, Elected/Appointed Officers, para. B. (pg.3 of 37); Change NBEP Director to Parliamentarian. Effective date Jan. 2020.

Passed, 25-0.

Add line 23 to Indoor Shooting Rules, pg. 30-31 Sect J to read: No lighted nocks allowed.

Add line 15 to Shooting Rules, pg.27-28: No lighted nocks allowed

Justification: After complaints from 2019 State Indoor about distractions to other archers and also follow NFSA rules, we would like this added to shooting Rules. Effective, Jan 2020.

Both items passed, 17-8.





Two Rivers Archery Club Builds Indoor Archery Range

To start, let me give you a little background on Two Rivers Archery Club. We were the ninth club to join the Virginia Bowhunters Association back in the 1950's. In the years since it's inception the club has had to move and construct five different outdoor archery ranges. In 1986, with the club membership down to only about 15 members, they decided to form a corporation and purchase a parcel of land to establish a permanent home for the club. Funds were raised by selling shares in the corporation and a 21 acre lot was found along Happy Creek and Dismal Hollow Roads near Front Royal, Virginia. Negotiations were made with the owner to purchase the the land with owner financing and after a year or so the club was able to sell off a five acre lot and pay off the land.

The club had to get a special exemption form the Zoning Commission to establish an archery range. Part of that exemption included a proposed indoor range in the future. With the hard work of its members and the influx of new members, our outdoor NFAA 28 target range, practice area, kitchen, pavilion, and storage buildings were constructed and the club has become one of the finer clubs in the state and has hosted several State Championship Tournaments.

With the time and effort needed to maintain our range and club by the handful of members willing to do the work, thoughts of a indoor range were put aside. I always knew that if one person would stand up, commit, and take charge an indoor building could become reality. In 2015, nearly thirty years after the concept, Jay Sealock stepped up and took the lead. The club voted to raise funds and start construction on the indoor building.

Fundraisers were started including a cash dinner, raffles, candle sales, field and 3D league shoots, soliciting donations and the selling of refundable shares. Plans, pricing, and permits were obtained. The club decided to construct a pole building 40x120 feet from a kit supplied by 84 Lumber for a cost of about \$25,000 for materials. Jay got fellow archer Ralf to donate equipment and time to take down trees and level a site for the building. With some gravel donated by a local quarry and spread by club member Shane with his equipment, we were ready to start construction.

In March of 2016, on a cold windy snowy Saturday a group of club members drilled the holes for the posts and construction was officially started. All the labor for the construction of the building, with a few exceptions, has been donated by club members and their friends willing to help out. Materials were purchased as funds were available. By September the post had been set and headers and perlings installed.

With a core group of Jay Sealock (Vice President) Maxie Cameron (Range Captain) and Rob Pecora (President) organizing and attending most work parties, the push was on to get the building under roof. Maxie was able to get a local construction company to donate the crane to install the roof rafters and Jay got the labor together to help. Work parties were held every weekend and many club members and non-club members came out to help with the construction. Membership in the club also doubled as progress continued. Vance Cave was instrumental in helping getting the metal roof and side installed and got a crew from his company to install a ceiling. Mark Lohr donated his time to mill lumber for the rear walls. Jay and JR Kirby did all the electrical work with donated and scavenged parts.

Vance also got his company to donate some very nice kitchen cabinets while Jay and Shenandoah County Archers donated a lot of tables and chairs.

DGIF REPORTS FINAL 2019 – 2020 CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE SURVEILLANCE RESULTS

RICHMOND, VA- The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) has concluded the 2019 – 2020 chronic wasting disease (CWD) surveillance efforts in Virginia's white-tailed deer population. As previously reported, DGIF confirmed CWD in 21 white-tailed deer in northwestern Virginia during the 2019 hunting season. Thirteen CWD-positive deer originated from Frederick County, five originated from Shenandoah County, two were harvested in Clarke County, and one deer was harvested in Fauquier County. No infected deer were detected in Culpeper, Madison, or Orange counties. DGIF worked with dozens of taxidermists statewide to enhance Virginia's CWD surveillance. Over 2,100 samples from hunter-harvested deer were submitted by participating taxidermists, and besides the detection in Fauquier County, no additional positive deer were detected from this effort. DGIF staff are very appreciative for the enthusiasm and cooperation demonstrated by taxidermists and hunters who aided in these sampling efforts.

As a result of the 2019 CWD surveillance efforts, DGIF is expanding the boundaries of Disease Management Area 2 (DMA2). DMA2 will now include Fauquier, Loudoun, Page, and Rappahannock counties, in addition to Culpeper, Madison, and Orange counties. DMA1 will continue to include Clarke, Frederick, Shenandoah, and Warren counties.

In an effort to reduce spread of CWD, year-round feeding of deer is now prohibited in Prince William County, in addition to Albemarle, Buchanan, Clarke, Culpeper, Dickenson, Fauquier, Frederick, Greene, Loudoun, Louisa, Madison, Orange, Page, Rappahannock, Rockingham, Shenandoah, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Warren, and Wise counties, where feeding has already been prohibited year-round. The feeding prohibition helps prevent the congregation of deer and therefore aids in preventing the spread of the disease from sick to healthy individuals. The rehabilitation of white-tailed deer fawns collected from Fauquier, Loudoun, Page, and Rappahannock counties is now prohibited, effective immediately, in addition to the other counties included in DMA1 and DMA2 (Clarke, Culpeper, Frederick, Madison, Orange, Shenandoah, and Warren).

This spring and summer, the DGIF will be working with cooperating partners to determine the most appropriate measures moving forward. These measures may include regulation changes, enhanced CWD surveillance, and other methods designed to assess and manage the spread of the disease. Expanded CWD surveillance efforts will be continued in fall 2020 utilizing predominately hunter-harvested deer.

CWD has been detected in twenty-six states and three Canadian provinces. In Virginia, a total of 88 deer have tested positive since 2009. This incurable disease, found in deer, elk, and moose in North America, is a slow and progressive neurologic disease that ultimately results in death of the animal. The disease-causing agent is spread through the urine, feces, and saliva of infected animals. Noticeable symptoms, though they may not appear in animals for several months to over a year, include staggering, abnormal posture, lowered head, drooling, confusion, and marked weight loss. There is no evidence that CWD can be transmitted naturally to humans, pets, or livestock (with the possible exception of pigs), but the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention advise hunters to test all deer harvested from known CWD-positive areas and to not consume any animals that test positive for the disease.

Natural Deer Urine Attractants Illegal in Virginia

FOREWORD: *The VDHA does a biannual survey in order to address seasons, bag limits, either sex hunting days and game law regulations that affect our membership. In 2015, the Virginia Game Department passed a regulation making it illegal to possess or use deer scents/lures that contain natural deer urine or other bodily fluids while taking, attempting to take, attracting or scouting wildlife in Virginia. Please be advised that the context of this column is the opinion of the author.*

The question about the use of natural deer urine has never been addressed in our survey. Therefore, we have no input related to the subject from our members and have no way of knowing their position regarding the issue. However, this will be a question in the next survey.

To Virginia's Deer Hunters,

As all of you hopefully know by now, the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries adopted a new regulation effective this past fall that made it illegal to possess or use deer scents and lures that contain natural deer urine or other bodily fluids while taking, attempting to take, attracting, or scouting wildlife in Virginia. The Department took this proactive action to help minimize the risk of introducing Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) into new areas in Virginia. CWD poses a real and significant risk to Virginia's deer herd. It could also have a devastating impact on deer hunting which generates over \$500 million dollars annually to the state's economy.

Over the past months, there have been several articles in Virginia newspapers and in the national outdoor press by persons questioning the need for, and the science behind, Virginia's CWD urine ban. Unfortunately, these writers have based their opinions on distortions of the facts and truth about CWD. The most basic fact that is omitted from these articles is that nearly all of the critics of the Virginia urine ban who have taken time to write have direct economic ties to the captive deer industry. To quote Upton Sinclair, a Pulitzer

Prize winning novelist, "It is difficult to get a man to understand something when his salary depends on him not understanding it." Let's take a look at a few of their CWD facts and science.

The first item the urine ban naysayers will mention is research that suggests CWD transmission by urine is a low risk. Low risk is not zero risk. What they fail to mention is the rest of the story. The infectious agents that cause CWD (prions) are shed by CWD-infected deer in urine, saliva, and feces. Saliva and feces are reported to be higher risk than urine. Deer urine is collected from captive deer by housing these deer on grates or slatted floors, and any other fluids shed by these deer (saliva, feces, etc.) are also collected. Consequently, these deer urine products also contain both deer saliva and deer feces. Furthermore, research has clearly demonstrated that environmental contamination from CWD-infected materials (urine, saliva, and/or feces) will continue to transmit CWD for years. No CWD-infected animals even need to be present, only the environmental contamination from CWD-infected urine, saliva, and/or feces.

The second assertion the critics of the urine ban make is that the urine only comes from captive deer herds that have been continuously monitored for CWD for five consecutive years and are considered certified deer herds. This statement is false. Deer urine is not a regulated industry or product, and there is no federal or state agency that can certify deer urine based products as CWD-free.

In fact, there is no CWD-free captive deer certification or monitoring program. The five-year CWD monitoring program the urine supporters frequently mention is a loose reference to a voluntary national US Department of Agriculture (USDA) CWD captive herd certification program that was initiated in 2012. Under this USDA program, captive deer herds that have been monitored for at least five consecutive years are certified "as low risk for CWD".

This national CWD monitoring program is administered by individual states whose state CWD monitoring programs are USDA approved. Unfortunately, since 2012, CWD has been detected in at least four captive deer herds that were certified as low risk for CWD. A fifth CWD certified captive deer herd withdrew from their state/USDA CWD monitoring program and was found to be CWD positive several months later. When this fifth deer pen was depopulated, 80% of the deer in it were CWD positive. The national USDA CWD herd certification program commonly cited as the captive deer industry's safety net is not mandatory and, more importantly, recent CWD events clearly show that it does not and cannot guarantee that captive deer herds are CWD-free.

Lastly, the most outlandish of the critics of the urine ban assertions is that the captive deer industry deer herds are less of a CWD risk than wild free-ranging deer. To date, CWD has been found in more than 140 captive deer herds in 16 states and two Canadian provinces.

Over the past twenty plus years, the Department's deer management staff has taken deer management positions and enacted regulations to be as proactive as possible with regards to trying to keep CWD out of Virginia. Our goal with the urine ban is to minimize the risk of introducing CWD into new areas in Virginia to protect the long-term health of the Virginia deer herd and to protect our wild free-ranging fair chase Virginia deer hunting heritage for the current and future generations.

Ingredients

- 1lb. ground Venison
- 1 egg
- 1/3 cup bread crumbs
- 1/2tsp. black pepper
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder
- 1 clove garlic minced
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tbsp. oil
- 1 1/2 cup thinly sliced onion
- 2 tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 1 cup beef broth
- 1/2 tsp. salt

Directions

In a large bowl, mix together the ground Venison, egg, bread crumbs, pepper, salt, onion powder, garlic, and Worcestershire sauce. Form into thick patties. Heat the oil in a large skillet over medium heat.

Fry the patties and onion in the oil until patties are nicely browned. Remove the beef patties to a plate, and keep warm. Sprinkle flour over the onions and drippings in the skillet. Stir in flour with a fork, scraping bits of Venison off of the bottom as you stir. Gradually mix in the beef broth. Season with seasoned salt. Simmer and stir over medium-low heat for about 5 minutes, until the gravy thickens. Turn heat to low, return patties to the gravy, cover, and simmer for another 15 minutes.

Conservation Scholarship





ORDER OF THE GOLDEN FEATHER

NOMINATIONS DUE IN MARCH

The VBA Order of the Golden Feather was created to honor those persons who have given unselfishly of their time and talents toward the betterment of archery and archers. Recipients are persons who possess the virtues of sportsmanship, character, morals, integrity and friendship. As a reflection of the substance for membership, only 86 people have been elected to the Order in the past 78 years.

To be qualified, a candidate must be member in good standing of the VBA at the time of nomination, must have a minimum of ten successive years' membership in the VBA and must be sponsored by three VBA members of good standing or by a VBA Club.

This article is a reminder that candidates must be submitted to the Board of Directors at the March meeting for this year. Nominations must be in writing and be signed by sponsoring individuals or a Club officer. Successful nominees have always performed duties or had an impact outside their immediate club.
